Your puppy is of exceptional quality and is sold with a health guarantee as follows...

Hip Guarantee: Both parents are certified by the Orthopedic Foundation of Animals or at the very least have had preliminary hip clearances from Dr. Butchco. *Your puppy is guaranteed for three years to have no symptoms of hip dysplasia.*

Eye Guarantee: Both parents are cleared annually from any genetic eye problems. Copies for all examinations are provided for you and your Veterinarian and are included in your puppy's package. *Your puppy is guaranteed for three years to be free of any eye problems.*

Heart Guarantee: Both parents have had heart clearances from Dr. Butchco and have been cleared of any heart defects. *Your puppy is guaranteed for three years to be free of any heart defect.*

Please Note! In order to be covered by the above guarantee...

- 1) You must have your dog evaluated by the OFA by the time he/she is 36 months.
- 2) You must have your dog's eyes examined by a licensed ophthalmologist by the time he/she is 36 months of age.
- 3) Your puppy must be kept on "NuVet Plus Canine Supplements" to insure proper nutrition. 800-474-7044, order code#81762.
- 4) There can be no excessive rough play, running, or any hard activities until your puppy is two years old! *This kind of exhaustive playing can actually cause joint and bone problems because of soft tissue development within the first two years.*

In the unlikely event your dog should have hip dysplasia confirmed by OFA, or have a genetic eye or heart problem before August 2010, the full purchase price will be applied toward a puppy from a litter of your choice bred by Blue Haven Kennels at Blue Haven's Discretion. The credit will be applied upon receipt of the dog's registration papers signed over to Blue Haven Kennels with a statement from your Veterinarian stating the problem with the dog. Any payment made by Blue Haven Kennels for surgery or medical procedures that need to be done will be at the breeder's discretion.

Refunds are not given in part or in full, except in unusual circumstances and at the sole discretion of Blue Haven Kennels. ***All conditions in this guarantee must be met or it is considered null and void.***

Congratulations on your new puppy and thank you for choosing us! We are going to try to make this process as easy as possible for you and your new addition by answering a few frequently asked questions.

What do we do when we get home?

Get acquainted...

Once you bring your puppy home, it is a good idea to have a get acquainted session in a nice, quiet room. Give your puppy some water but withhold food for a couple of hours to let the queasiness pass from traveling. Allow him to sniff everywhere and everyone so he can get used to his new surroundings.

Offer toys...

This would also be a perfect time to give him his new toys as he will surely be hunting for something to chew on! When you see him clamp down on something you don't want him to, just take his mouth off of it and give him his toy. Remember that chewing is a natural instinct, so please provide plenty of chewing toys.

Let him sleep...

After the get acquainted session you can offer a small meal and then your puppy will need a nap. Puppies stress out in new surroundings and need to adjust slowly. New smells, new family, new water...all this is a lot for a little one, so please treat him carefully.

Begin housebreaking...

Anytime your puppy wakes up, immediately after eating, and of course anytime you notice the signs of nature calling, take him outdoors through the *same* door to the *same* spot outside, and use the *same* word or phrase. This will help to housebreak him. Be prepared for accidents on the carpet though, it most likely will happen. If you catch him in the act, quickly give a firm NO and bring him outside to the designated spot. When he does go outside give him praise, praise, praise! He will soon learn.

In addition we highly suggest crate training your puppy. All dogs want a quiet, cozy place to den, and getting them used to the crate is both beneficial to you and your dog and will definitely help with housebreaking.

What should I feed my puppy?

Meal time...

Please do not change your puppies food for at least the first forty eight hours. To make this easier we have included a zip lock storage bag for you of Kirkland Chicken and Rice which is what we give to all our puppies and feel it is an excellent choice.

Labs love to eat! In observing our own dogs it seems as though they inhale their food which is why we soak their food in water. This lessens bloat and regurgitation. In addition, you might want to try mixing in some plain yogurt, as this is a very healthy addition to your puppies meal. It is very important that you establish a feeding schedule because dogs are creatures of habit and thrive on a routine. A schedule will also help to housebreak him. Normally puppies should be fed around one cup of kibble twice a day until they are about five or six months old. Your Veterinarian will help you set up a feeding schedule.

What supplies does my puppy need?

Supplies...

Your new friend will need a crate, blanket, collar, leash, high quality food, plenty of fresh water, chew toys such as rawhide bone, doggy treats for training, clean up gear to clean up his messes, brush, nail clippers, appropriate vaccinations, regular check ups and of course plenty of exercise, love and praise.

Playing...

Play and have fun with your dog everyday! He will adore you and really want to please you. The fact that Labradors are so willing to please their master is why they are so wonderfully successful at just about anything they do. Labs are strong and athletic with a zest for life and are not meant to lie on the couch all day. They love to run, fetch and of course swim! Giving your Lab plenty of opportunity for this kind of exercise is important and will help keep him in good health.

Training...

Labs are happy, dedicated, even tempered, hard working, and ambitious dogs. If you put forth the time and effort it takes to train them, your joy, and your dog's joy will be immeasurable! We highly recommend *15 Minutes to a Great Dog* by Kevin Michalowski. This book is very informative and gives you all the details you need to train your dog in just a few minutes a day.

Feeding...

Nutrition is extremely important in keeping your Lab healthy. Your Veterinarian will help you choose an appropriate food for your dog. Keep in mind that the less expensive brands of dog food are not as digestible and will end up creating more waste for you to clean up.

Bathing...

Your dog has a dual coat. The hair that you see is called the top coat. It has a natural oil on it that serves the same function as wax on a car. It makes water bead up. The second coat is called the undercoat. It is very dense and protects your dog from the cold. A good weekly brushing is usually all that is needed to keep your Lab's coat clean. He should only be bathed three or four times a year.

Vaccinations...

The vaccinations your puppy has received is written on your Sales Agreement page. It is your responsibility to establish a relationship with a good Veterinarian and to bring your puppy in for regular check-ups. He or she will give the appropriate vaccines to your pup.
